**13/25** Apologies – Cllr Derek Boustred sent his apologies which were accepted. There were no apologies received from Cllr Sara Randall Johnson or Cllr Henry Gent (DCC).

#### 14/25 Declarations of Interest Under the Code of Conduct

#### 15/25 Minutes

The Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> March 2025 were unanimously approved as a true and accurate record.

#### 16/25 Public Question Time

No questions were raised.

#### 17/25 Co-opting of New Councillor

The Parish Council welcomes Mike Kemp as a new councillor. Relevant forms to co-opt Mr Kemp were signed appropriately. Clerk to send to Electoral services.

#### 18/25 Lead Councillor Updates

 Finances to note £969 received as HMRC VAT reclaim. Last DD for EDF has been processed. The Council are now with Yu as a supplier. They do not charge a standing charge.

#### **o** Highways Report

Despite the heavy rain and at least 5 flood alerts the village has not suffered more than minor surface water to date

There have been sewage works going on around the village to establish the location of a possible leak. This has resulted in temporary traffic lights. I have no current information at the present time.

There are no other Highways issues to report.

#### **Bench For School Football field**

Permission has been granted from the school head to put a bench in the school football field. Head has agreed to this. Approval sought to pay £250 towards this. Approved by Chair and seconded by the Vice Chair. Council is happy to go ahead and order one from Devon Contract Waste (DCW). This will be made from recycled materials. We also have contributions of approximately £100 each from Helen Sims (litter picks and Saturday Market) and our environmental group CARE.

#### Bench for Mill Bus Stop

Permission is currently being sort from Stage coach to place a bench at the Mill bus stop. Stagecoach will not furnish so need to contact Highways to see if we can have permission to put a bench in the bus stop. Clerk to contact Highways to ask permission

#### Price For Planters in River Close

Currently being sourced from DCW. To discuss at the next meeting when prices have been secured.

- **Playpark** Measured for new sign, this can now be ordered. Cllr Maunder has done a fine job of cutting the hedges. Grass now needs cutting and gateway. The Chair will email Beers to ask if we can use the ride on mower.
- Footpaths- Signs, vegetation growth and a large puddle still not looked at by DCC (along the old railway). Email Andy Hill to contact Cllr M Kemp to discuss. Footpath to Brampford Speke dog waste bin is off the post Clerk to report to Highways. The pedestrian rail crossing at Sandy Lane has been closed again. Footpath warden will contact Network Rail to discuss.
- **Planning** Roundhouse at bottom of Stoke Hill, put up acoustic fencing and also re-application by R May to build 5 properties. No comments to make.
- **Environment** No environmental report great British clean up at end of March tidy up being organised by Derek. Hall tabletop sale is being organised.

Thousands more children to receive Bikeability cycle training

# Over 9,300 schoolchildren in Devon are to benefit from <u>Bikeability</u> cycle training this financial year, see <u>https://www.bikeability.org.uk/</u>

That's thanks to a Bikeability Funding award of just over £451,000 to us for 2025/26.

The funding is part of £3.9 million of funding recently announced by the Government and Active Travel England (ATE) for cycling and walking projects in Devon, which was the largest settlement for any South West authority.

Bikeability cycle training provides schoolchildren with lifelong road safety skills while also improving their health and wellbeing.

Over the past 19 years, we have provided Bikeability cycle training to almost 120,000 young people across the county.

Adult cyclists are reminded that they can also book <u>free confidence sessions through Active</u> <u>Devon</u> at <u>https://activedevon.org/adult-cycle-training/</u>

The sessions, delivered by qualified bike Instructors, can cater for up to three people at a time and can be tailored to suit all abilities and goals, from first-time riders to regular cyclists looking to improve their skills.
